Yellowknife author Amber Henry's new book, Northern Princess, has officially hit shelves.

This is Henry's second children's book and third book overall, and was set for both a release and an in-person signing event on Sept. 18.

Though the signing was moved to a virtual bed-time story reading event, the release held true.

"The build to this day has been so exciting and a long time coming," said Henry. "I feel like tomorrow is going to feel a little boring in comparison."

The Book Cellar, which was chosen as the then signing location, was picked for the previous event due to the support that Henry had received from the organization.

"Judith, at the Book Cellar, has been [great]" said Henry. "She's been a wonderful source of information for me in the process of publishing all three of my books. It seemed natu-

ral to ask her if I could launch Northern Princess there."

For those worried about not getting a copy of Henry's new book, the author says never fear.

"There are plenty of copies for anyone interested," she says. "I had them printed at Canarctic Graphics, here in town, and now have boxes and boxes of books available. They can be purchased at the Yellowknife Book Cellar, The Gallery of the Midnight Sun or from me at www.amberhenrywrites.com."


As for Henry's future, she's been busy working on the plans for pop-up shops for the next couple of months.

"Whether they are virtual or in person," said Henry. "From October to December I'll gather a variety of local vendors to set up at Copperhouse and sell their wares. I'll be at these sales with my Northern Princess books and a few holiday gift ideas inspired by the book. If we need to do virtual shops we have a facebook page called Made in the North - virtual pop up shop."
